On June 14th, Silver Spurs Cowboy Church and Right Foot Ranch partnered to bring the spirit of the West to Celebration Villa's "Buckaroo Bash." Though the forecast called for rain, God had other plans—the sun broke through, and the event went on with joy and purpose.

Residents came out in large numbers to meet and pet the horses, and several even took a ride. One resident was moved to tears as she remembered her younger days in the saddle. Another, who had suffered a stroke and had not spoken since, found her voice again during her experience. These moments were nothing short of miraculous.

We also received a touching message from a mother of a 3-year-old non-verbal autistic child. She shared:

"My daughter doesn't even attempt to talk most days. After her first pony ride, she decided to talk a blue streak. She said 10 unique words. I've never seen her sit still, and she did amazing sitting still on the horse."



The Healing Power of Horses

These stories are powerful reminders of the therapeutic benefits of horseback riding, especially for individuals with physical, emotional, or developmental challenges. Known as equine-assisted therapy, riding helps improve:

- Balance and coordination
- Muscle tone and flexibility
- Sensory integration
- Confidence and emotional regulation
- Communication and social skills

The rhythmic motion of a horse mimics the human gait, which can stimulate neurological pathways and promote speech and motor development. The bond between horse and rider also fosters trust, patience, and joy—often unlocking breakthroughs that traditional therapies may not reach.

We are so grateful to everyone who made this event possible and to God for blessing us with sunshine and unforgettable moments. The Buckaroo Bash was more than just a fun day—it was a day of healing, hope, and heart.

 We're celebrating two amazing kiddos graduating from our Ranch hand Program! Stay tuned for highlights.

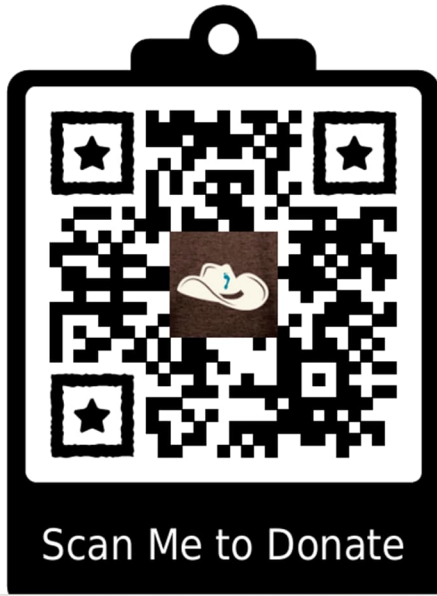
- 🐾 July 18 – Pennwood for the ARC
